- O Create a University of Arizona Net ID.
- Complete your <u>FAFSA</u> and the College of Information Science (InfoSci) application for Financial Aid
 if needed; scholarship deadlines are March 1st for the fall semester and October 15th for the
 spring semester.
- O Visit the Office of Scholarships and Financial Aid for information on loans, grants and university scholarships.
- O Submit your Campus Health Immunization Records (Main Campus).
- O Log into UAccess Student Center and explore your record, update your address and info as needed.
- O Get your CatCard Student ID (Main Campus).
- O Sign up for classes check <u>degree requirements</u> on the website as well as <u>advising resources</u>. Visit the <u>Guide to Register for Classes</u>. All students are required to take LIS 504 in their firstsemester.
- O Read the MLIS Student Handbook for all policies and procedures.
- O Familiarize yourself with the <u>University of Arizona Library</u> tools and resources for graduate students.
- O Update your bank/direct deposit information on <u>UAccess Employee/Manager Self Service</u> if you are hired as a GA/TA or student worker.
